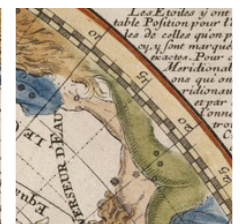
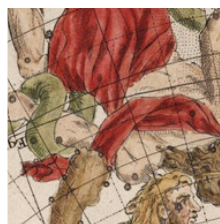

MARC BLOCH PRIZE IN EARLY MODERN & MODERN EUROPEAN HISTORY

(15th - 21st centuries)

The Marc Bloch Prize for 2015 will be awarded to the author of the best new MA thesis in early modern or modern European history and in the history of Europe in the world.

In keeping with two central aspects of Marc Bloch's historical oeuvre, only studies with an explicit comparative or transnational perspective will be considered.

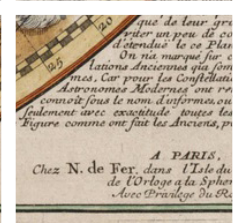
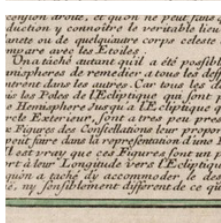
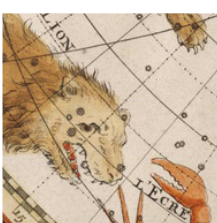
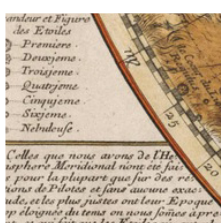
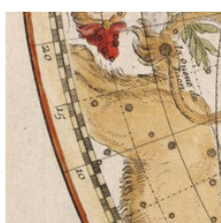
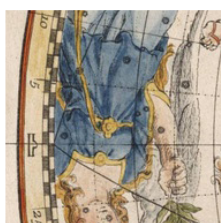
Submitted theses should be of a high scholarly historical nature. Research accuracy, innovation and literary merit will be important factors in the final selection.

Eligibility is limited to candidates holding an MA degree (awarded in 2013 or 2014). EUI members are not eligible. Theses must be submitted by the original author, and can be submitted in any European language.

A prize of € 3.000 will be awarded in a ceremony at the EUI in Florence. The winner of the prize will be invited to give a talk on the subject of her/his thesis.
